Healthy Happenings



High blood pressure, or hypertension, impacts over a third of the population in the Virginia Peninsula Foodbank's service area. With the food tradeoffs and unavailability of certain low sodium items that our neighbors in need are often subjected to, this disease impacts our neighbors in need even more. Healthcare services are expensive to treat hypertension and access to healthy foods that are low in sodium and high nutrients that promote good blood pressure are often unaffordable and seemingly unreachable. With such a huge problem, innovative, collaborative solutions are needed.

What is our answer to this seemingly insurmountable issue? In partnership with Riverside Health Systems, the Urban League of Hampton Roads, Brooks Crossing Innovation and Opportunity Center, and the American Heart Association, we have launched the Food as Medicine program. Patients from Riverside Health Systems' Riverside Charlie W. and Golden Bethune Hill Community Clinic are participating in a 6 month pilot, centered around using food and physical activity as medicine, with nutrition classes, as well as distributions of low sodium, low sugar, and lean protein foods being provided by Virginia Peninsula Foodbank. We also teach classes discussing the link between high blood pressure and nutrition and the foods being distributed promote the use of the DASH, or Dietary Approaches to Stop Hypertension, diet, which has been shown through clinical research to lower blood pressure and bad cholesterol, as well as promote weight loss and weight maintenance in obese individuals. Riverside has been providing exercise classes, fun walks, and regular visits with a clinician to track patients' success through the course of this program. With innovative programs like this, we at the Virginia Peninsula Foodbank hope to continue to promote the right to good health and good food, even in the face of hunger, health, and economic disparities.

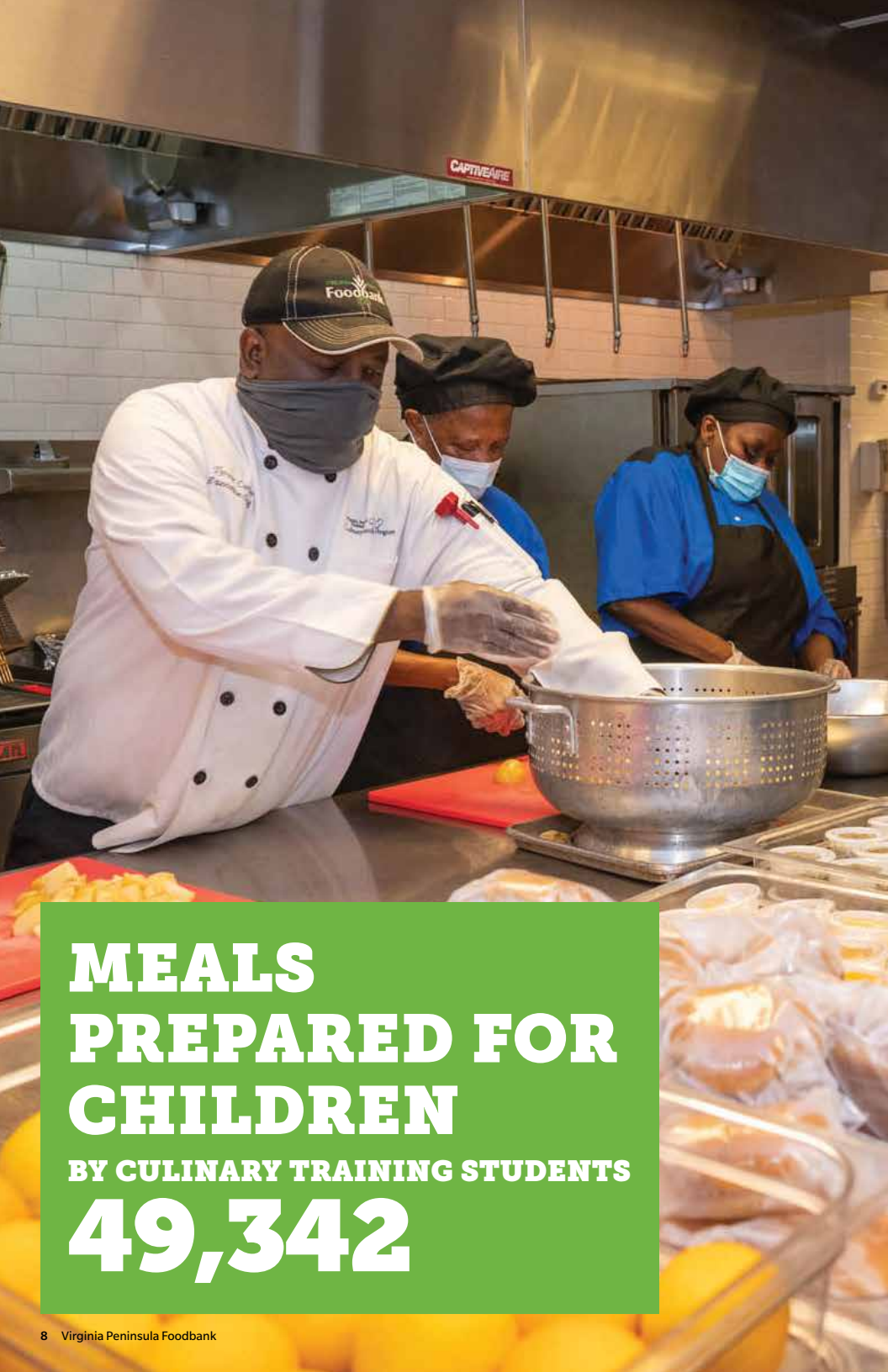

Adding Spice to Life with Hard Work



Dawn Suiter knew she needed to get some “fire back” into her life. She had always enjoyed the culinary arts and started classes at two culinary schools, but something was missing. In 2011, she enrolled in the Foodbank’s Culinary Training Program in its second class of students.

“That program was different,” Dawn says. “I had a lot to learn, but they taught me to be not just a professional chef, but a professional person.” Dawn graduated from the program having earned top honors and she eventually became a sous chef at NASA Langley.



However, Dawn aspired to create her own business. “The Culinary Training Program opened doors for me,” she states. “The whole team there has my back always. They were right there with me as I got to the milestones that would help me achieve my goals.”



Now 11 years later, Dawn, currently known as “Chef Dawn Diva,” owns a catering company she started in 2014. She has served as a private chef, appeared on the Hampton Roads Show and other television programs. She currently is preparing to publish her first book and is in the process of launching “Diva Spice,” her personal collection of spices which will begin to appear in local stores and online. “I am honestly doing what I love,” Dawn says with an enthusiastic smile.

When asked what she would tell others who are interested in making a positive change in their lives, Dawn says, “I always imagined I’d do something incredible, but I just needed a way to get there. Believe in yourself. One day, you might be an example for others.”

Agency Highlight

Albin “AB” Fulcher is 85 years young and leads the Union Baptist Food Pantry in Gloucester. He started distributing food from the back of a pick-up truck in 2003. In 2009, he convinced his church to join the Foodbank. Since then, he’s been a steady fixture in the Gloucester community to residents, churches, schools and vendors. His participation

in our Neighbor-to-Neighbor program allows him to be mostly self-sufficient in serving approximately 100 families each week. When he does have more food than he can distribute, he shares with other partners in Gloucester like Bread For Life and Salvation Army-Gloucester.

AB loves the work but says it’s getting to be time for him to sit down. He is actively recruiting some of his helpers to take over and continue the work Gloucester residents have come to depend on to survive.

Resilience:

“The food pantry has been a lifesaver. Just today, we didn’t have enough to eat for lunch, but I was able to go to the pantry and now we have enough. They help us every month. It relieves my stress when I’m able to turn to them as utility bills stack up and cupboards run bare.” — Angela

“I was reluctant to come to the food pantry – I am so used to doing things on my own. It didn’t feel right to be asking for help. But it is a huge blessing. 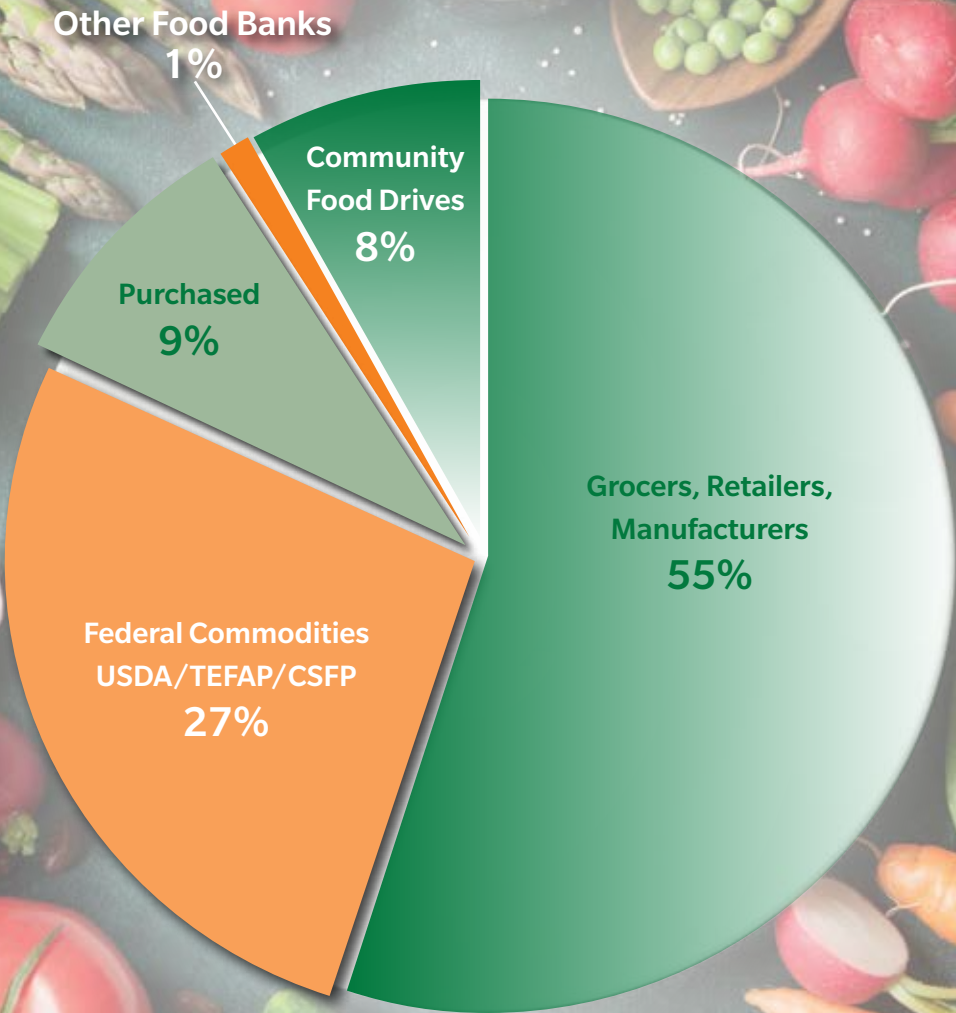
